Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: June/April to June 2026 statement

The rainfall for June was below normal over Koror. For the past three months, rainfall was near-normal over Koror.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Monthly/Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for August and August to October 2026 is very likely to be below normal over Palau.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during August 2026 is very likely to be above normal for majority of the main islands.

Maximum and minimum temperatures averaged over August to October 2026 are very likely to be above normal over Palau.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: June/April to June 2026

June sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around the main islands and Sonsorol were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

Averaged over April to June 2026, sea surface temperatures around Palau were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

June sea levels around Hatohebei were 100 to 200 mm above normal and sea levels around Angaur were 60 to 100 mm below normal.

A coral bleaching Watch status is currently in effect for majority of Palau as of July 10.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Ocean Variable statement

August and averaged over August to October 2026 sea surface temperatures around Palau are predicted to be near normal.

August and averaged over August to October 2026, sea levels around majority of Palau are predicted to be 100 to 200 mm below normal.

Coral Bleaching outlook indicates No Stress status for the next 4 weeks.

In brief for Teleconference

- Koror rainfall was below normal for June and near normal rainfall for April to June 2026.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates below average most likely in August 2026 and for total rainfall over August to October 2026.
- SSTs were above normal for June and April to June 2026. The outlook shows near normal SSTs for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were above normal for the southwest islands and below normal for the main islands for June. Below normal sea levels are predicted for August and August to October 2026.

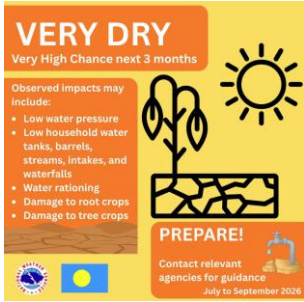
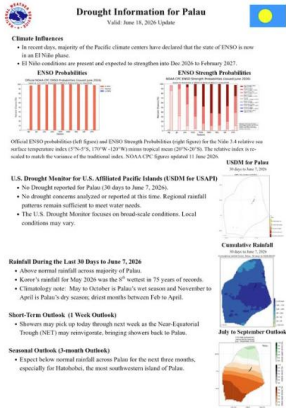

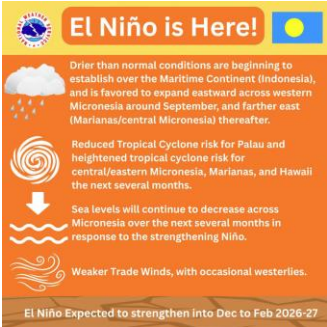

Sector-Specific Climate Training-COSPPac-UNEP CISPac-5 June 25  We are pleased to share that the National Weather Service Palau successfully led a one-day Sector-Specific Climate Training Program on June 25, 2025 at the Palau Royal Resort. This workshop brought together key stakeholders to discuss the Climate Sector Action and Communication Plan specifically for the agriculture, water, fisheries, and Disaster Risk Reduction sectors. The primary goal of the session was to facilitate the uptake of climate information services across these critical areas. Our efforts focused on increasing community's ability to adapt to changing seasonal conditions, with a specific emphasis on preparing for the anticipated onset of El Niño later this year and into early 2027. During the workshop, we reviewed and reassessed existing sector plans to ensure we are developing demand-driven solutions. By coordinating our activities and addressing current vulnerabilities, we are working toward establishing sustainable systems that ensure a safe and resilient Palau. The one-day training was funded by the UNEP CISPac5 and the iGreen Climate Fund Project.
