

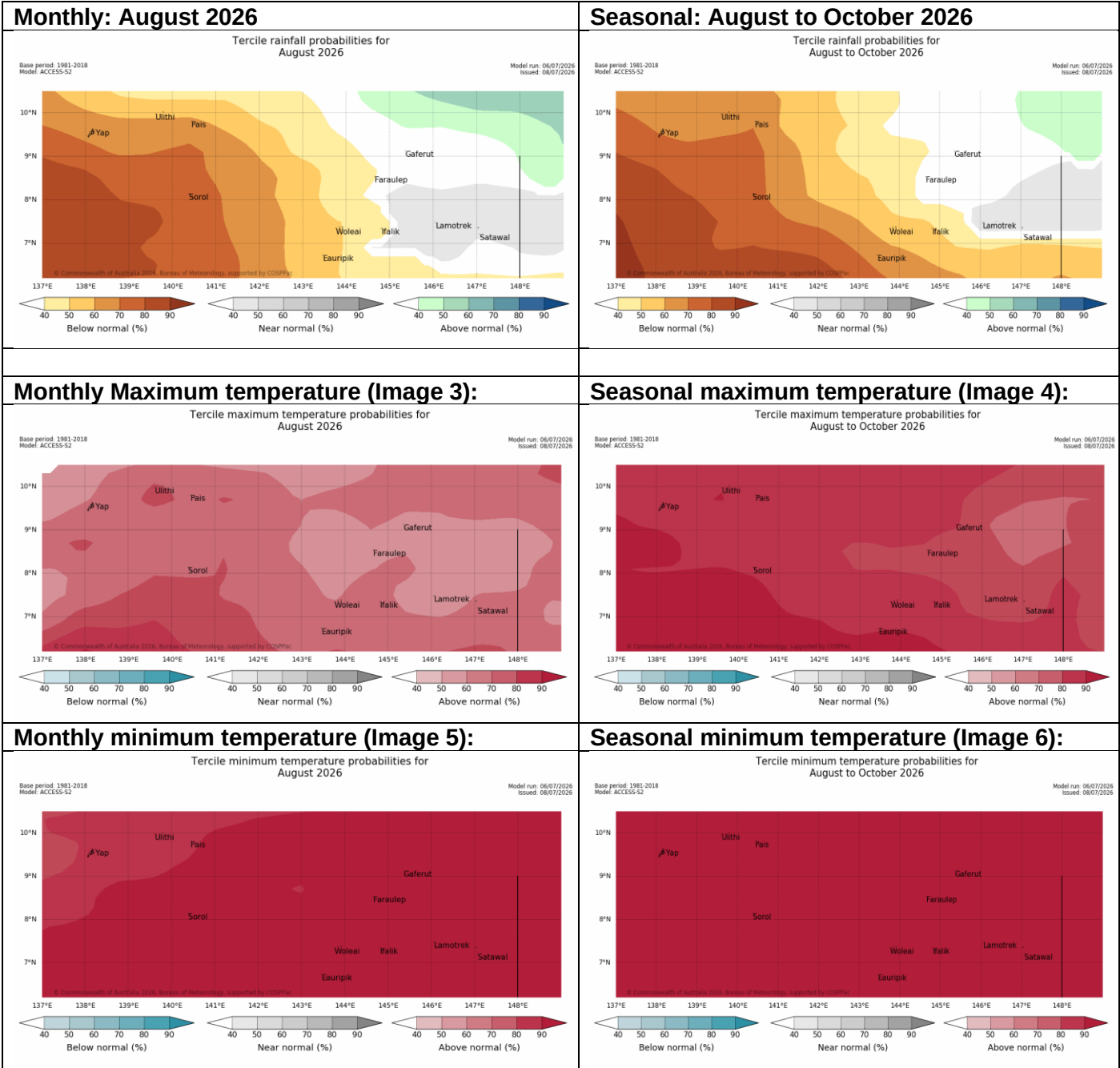

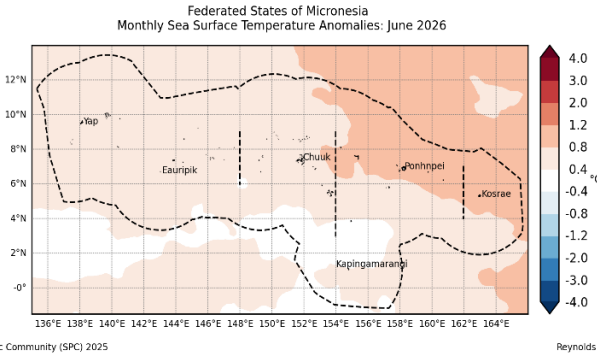

Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: June/April to June 2026 statement

The rainfall for June was below normal and near normal for the past three months over Yap Proper.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Monthly/Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for August 2026 likely or very likely to be below normal over most of the Yap islands, except for Gaferut that the outlook offers little guidance, and Lamotrek and Satawal that are likely to be near normal.

The rainfall for August to October 2026 is likely or very likely to be below normal over most of the Yap islands. In Faraulep, Gaferut, and Satawal the outlook offers little guidance. In Lamotrek, the outlook shows August to October 2026 rainfall, is likely to be near-normal.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during August 2026 are likely or very likely to be above normal over all islands in the state.

Maximum and minimum temperatures averaged over August to October 2026 are likely or very likely to be above normal over all islands in the state.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: June/April to June 2026

June and averaged over April to June sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around Yap State were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

June sea level around Yap State was 30 to 200 mm below normal.

A coral bleaching Watch status is currently in effect for Yap State as of 9th July 2026.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Ocean Variable statement

August 2026 and averaged over August to October 2026 sea surface temperatures around Yap State are predicted to be near-normal.

August 2026 sea levels around Yap State are predicted to be 100 to 300 mm below normal.

Averaged over August to October 2026, sea levels around Yap State are predicted to be 100 to 200 mm below normal.

In brief for Teleconference

- Rainfall was below normal for June and near normal for the period of April to June.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates below normal most likely in August and August to October.
- SSTs were above normal for June and April to June 2026. The outlook shows near-normal SSTs for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were below normal for June. Below normal sea levels are predicted for August and August to October 2026.
