Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: July/May to July 2026 statement

The rainfall for July and the past three-months period, was above normal over Main Island Yap.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Monthly/Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for September is likely to be above normal over Fais and very likely to be above normal for the rest of the islands to the east. For Main Island Yap and Ulithi the outlook offers little guidance.

The rainfall for September to November is very likely to be below normal over the western islands of Yap and Eauripik. For rest of the Yap islands to the east, the outlook shows September to November rainfall is likely below normal.

Maximum temperatures during September are likely to very likely to be above normal over most of the islands except for Main Island Yap, Ulithi and Fais that are very likely to be near normal. The outlook offers little guidance for Gaferut. The minimum temperatures during September are likely to very likely to be above normal across the whole state except for Ulithi, for which the outlook offers little guidance.

Maximum and minimum temperatures averaged over September to November 2026 are very likely to be above normal over Yap State.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: July/May to July 2026

July sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around Yap State were near normal to 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

Averaged over May to July 2026, sea surface temperatures around Yap State were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

July sea levels around Yap State were 30 to 200 mm below normal.

A coral bleaching Watch status is currently in effect for Main Island Yap, Ulithi, Fais and Gaferut as of 2nd August 2026.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Ocean Variable statement

For September and averaged over September to November, sea surface temperatures around Yap State are predicted to be near normal.

For September and averaged over September to November, sea levels around Yap State are predicted to be 100 to 200 mm below normal.

In brief for Teleconference

- Rainfall was above normal for July and the period of May to July.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates near normal most likely in September but below average for total rainfall over September to November 2026.
- SSTs were near normal to above normal for July and May to July. The outlook shows near normal SSTs for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were below normal for July. Below normal sea levels are predicted for September and September to November 2026.
