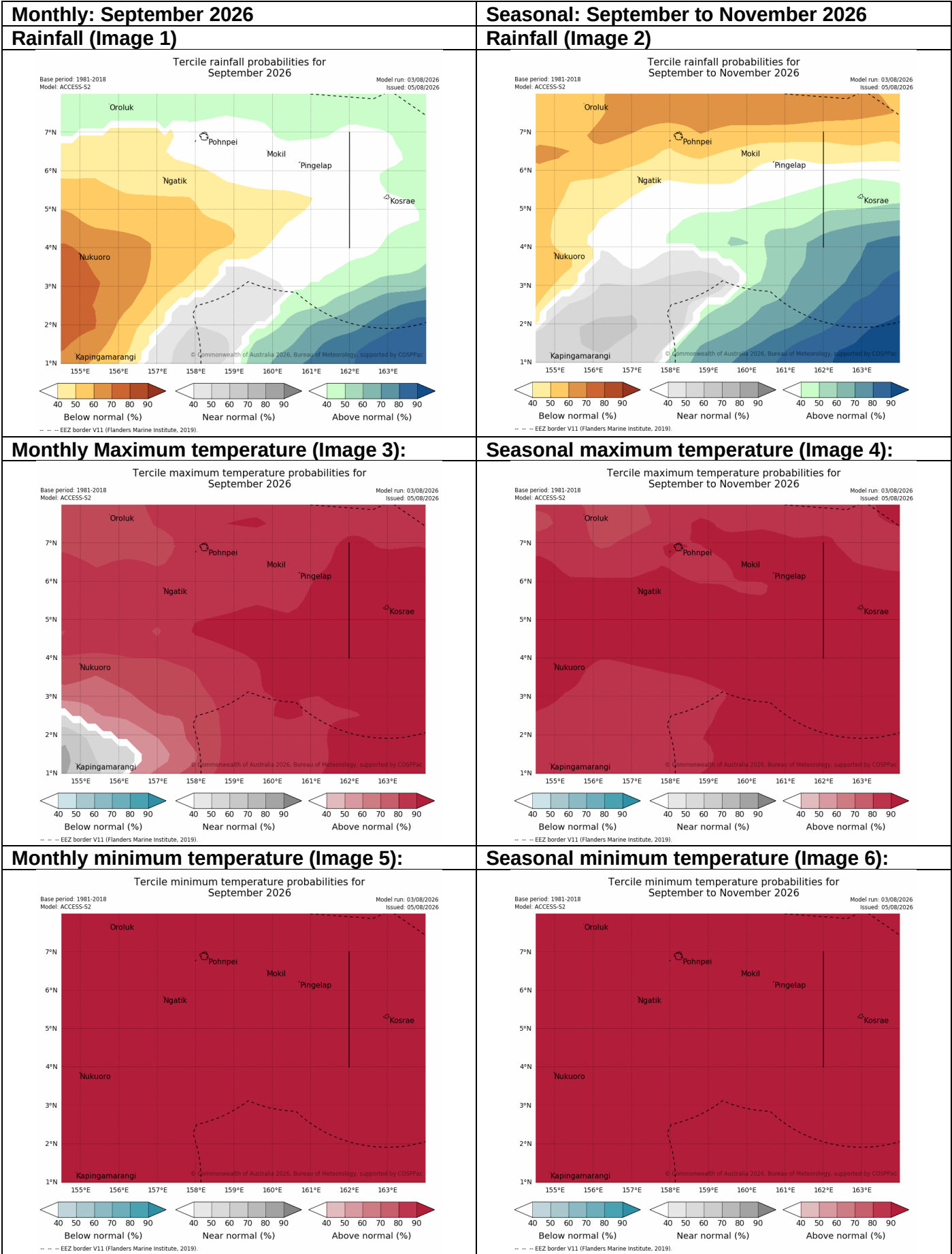

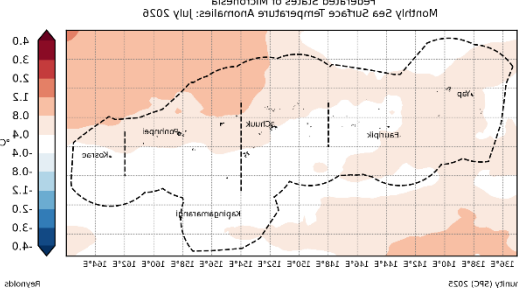

Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: July/May to July 2026 statement

The rainfall for July and May to July was above normal over Pohnpei and near normal over Kosrae. Pohnpei recorded its fourth wettest months of July and May to July on record.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Monthly/Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for September 2026 is likely to be above normal over Oroluk and below normal over Ngatik, Nukuoro, and Kapingamarangi. In Pohnpei, Mokil, Pingelap, and Kosrae, the outlook offers little guidance.

The rainfall for September to November 2026 is likely to be above normal over Kosrae. In Pohnpei, Oroluk, Ngatik, Mokil, and Nukuoro, the outlook shows September to November 2026 rainfall is likely to be below normal. In Kapingamarangi, the outlook shows September to November 2026 rainfall is likely to be near normal.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during September 2026 are very likely to be above normal over the region, except for Kapingamarangi, where the outlook shows September maximum temperature is likely to be near normal.

Maximum and minimum temperatures averaged over September to November 2026 are very likely to be above normal over the region.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: July/May to July 2026

July sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around Pohnpei and Kosrae were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

Averaged over May to July 2026, sea surface temperatures around Pohnpei and Kosrae were 0.4 to 0.8°C above normal.

July sea levels around Pohnpei and Kosrae were 30 to 200 mm below normal.

A coral bleaching Watch status is currently in effect for Kapingamarangi as of 2 August 2026.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for September and September to November 2026

Ocean Variable statement

September 2026 sea surface temperatures around Pohnpei and Kosrae are predicted to be near normal.

Averaged over September to November 2026, sea surface temperatures around Pohnpei and Kosrae are predicted to be near normal.

September 2026 sea levels around Pohnpei and Kosrae are predicted to be -100 to -200 mm below normal.

Averaged over September to November 2026, sea levels around Pohnpei and Kosrae are predicted to be -200 to -300 mm below normal.

Coral Bleaching outlook indicates Watch status for the next 12 weeks.

In brief for Teleconference

- The rainfall for July and May to July was above normal over Pohnpei and near normal over Kosrae. Pohnpei recorded its fourth wettest months of July and May to July on record.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates above normal over the northern part of the region, below normal over the southwestern part, most likely in September 2026. September to November outlook shows below normal over Oroluk, Pohnpei, Mokil, Ngatik and Nukuoro while Kosrae's outlook is likely to be above normal.
- SSTs were above normal for July and May to July 2026. The outlook shows near normal SSTs for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were below normal for July. Below normal sea levels are predicted for September and September to November 2026.
