Summary Statement

Monthly and last three months: June and April to June 2026 statement

The rainfall for June and April to June was above normal for the Republic of Naoero.

Part 1i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Monthly /Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

The rainfall for August 2026 is very likely to be above normal

The rainfall for August to October 2026 is also very likely to be above normal for the island.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during August and the average temperature for August to October are very likely to be above normal.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: June and April to June 2026

June sea surface temperatures (SSTs) around Naoero were 0.8 to 1.2°C above normal.

Averaged over April to June 2026, SSTs were also 1.2 to 2.0°C above normal

June sea levels around Naoero were above normal ranging from 100.0 to 200.0mm.

Coral bleaching around Naoero were on ALERT LEVEL 2 level on 6th June 2026.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Ocean Variable statement

August 2026 sea surface temperatures are predicted to be significantly above normal, with anomalies of 0.8-1.2°C. Similar significant SST departures are expected around Naoero for August to October period, with anomalies of 1.2-2.0°C.

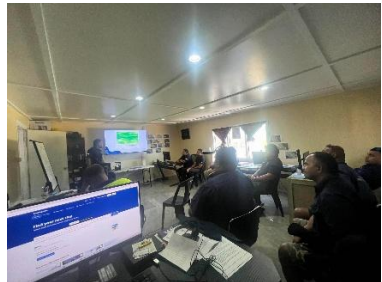
August 2026 sea levels around Naoero are predicted to be near-normal. For the next 3-month outlook from August to October, sea levels are also predicted to be near-normal.

Coral Bleaching 4-week outlook, Naoero is expecting WATCH ALERT coral bleaching as of 27 July 2026.

In brief for Teleconference

- Rainfall was above normal for June and April to June.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates above normal most likely in August and the next 3month from August to October 2026.
- SSTs were above normal for June and also April to June. SSTs are predicted to be significantly above normal for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were above normal in June. Sea levels are predicted to be near-normal for the next one- and three-month outlook.
- Coral bleaching: ALERT LEVEL 2 on 6th June 2026. WATCH out to 27th July 2026.
