Hanan Airport's June and April to June rainfall was below normal.

Monthly/Seasonal rainfall and temperature Outlook statements

Niue's August and August to October rainfall is very likely to be below normal.

Maximum and minimum temperatures during August and averaged over August to October are very likely to be below normal.

Part 2: Recent Ocean summary statement

Monthly and last three months: June/April to June 2026

June and averaged over April to June Sea surface temperature (SSTs) around Niue were near normal -0.4 to 0.8°C.

June sea levels around Niue were -30 to 100mm near normal.

Coral Bleaching for Niue at no stress alert.

Part 2i. Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks for August and August to October 2026

Ocean Variable statement

August sea surface temperatures around Niue are predicted to be -0.4°C near normal.

Averaged over August to October, sea surface temperatures around Niue are predicted to be -0.4°C near normal.

August and averaged over August to October, sea levels around Niue are predicted to be -30 to 100 mm below normal to near normal.

Coral Bleaching outlook indicates no stress and warning for the next 16 weeks.

In brief for Teleconference

- Rainfall was below normal for June and April to June.
- The rainfall outlook generally indicates below normal rainfall for August 2026 and August to October 2026.
- SSTs for June and averaged over April to June were near normal. The outlook shows above normal SSTs for the next one and three months.
- Sea levels were near normal for August. Below normal to near normal sea levels are predicted for August and August to October.
