Observations and Verification of October to December 2019 outlooks:

Observed rainfall for the one and three-month periods ending December 2019 were discussed for each PIC. This month, several countries experienced extreme rainfall as shown in the following table:

Validation of forecasts with observed rainfall for the months of October to December 2019 period showed 17 consistent, 28 near-consistent and 8 inconsistent outlooks (53 stations across 11 countries).

A summary of results (C-Consistent, NC-Near Consistent, In-Inconsistent, N/A-not available) for each country is as follows:

Overall: 17C, 28NC, 8In.

February to April 2020 Outlooks:

SCOPIC outlooks: 32% of the 59 stations have their highest probability in tercile 1, 8% in tercile 3, 2% in tercile 2, while 36% have near-equal probabilities in three terciles. The remaining 22% have near-equal probabilities in two terciles.

POAMA outlooks: 47% of the 47 stations have their highest probability in tercile 1, 28% in tercile 3, 4% in tercile 2, 13% have near-equal probabilities in three terciles, with the remaining 9% having near-equal probabilities in two terciles.
