#### Main purpose for the OCOF:

 To provide a regular forum for the 12 participating PIC NMSs to discuss the current ENSO status, recent one and three-month rainfall, drought (if present), their seasonal climate outlooks and stakeholders engagement with other countries and the COMP (Bureau of Meteorology and SPREP) project team.

In addition, it serves as an online training forum for recent SCOPIC development and gives the project team and the NMSs an opportunity to discuss other project related matters.

#### Observations and Verification of June to August 2020 outlooks:

Observed rainfall for the one and three-month periods ending August 2020 were discussed for each PIC. This month, several countries experienced extreme rainfall as shown in the following table:

Validation of forecasts with observed rainfall for the months of June to August 2020 period showed 16 consistent, 31 near-consistent and 12 inconsistent outlooks (59 stations across 12 countries).

A summary of results (C-Consistent, NC-Near Consistent, In-Inconsistent, N/A-not available) for each country is as follows:

**Cook Islands** (2NC); **Fiji** (5C,7NC, 1ln); **Kiribati** (1NC, 3ln); **RMI** (2NC,); **Niue** (1C); **Palau** (1NC); **PNG** (1C, 5NC, 3ln); **Samoa** (2NC, 2ln); **Solomon Islands** (2C, 5NC); **Tonga** (4C, 1NC, 1ln);

Tuvalu (2C, 2NC) and Vanuatu (1C, 3NC, 2In).

Overall: 16C, 31NC, 12In.

#### October to December 2020 Outlooks:

SCOPIC outlooks: None of the 61 stations have their highest probability in tercile 1, 10% in tercile 2, 16% in tercile 3, 41% have near-equal probabilities in two terciles and 33% have near-equal probabilities in three terciles.
