Main purpose for the OCOF:

 To provide a regular forum for the 12 participating PIC NMSs to discuss the current ENSO status, recent one and three-month rainfall, drought (if present), their seasonal climate outlooks and stakeholders engagement with other countries and the COMP (Bureau of Meteorology and SPREP) project team.

In addition, it serves as an online training forum for recent SCOPIC development and gives the project team and the NMSs an opportunity to discuss other project related matters.

Validation of forecasts with observed rainfall for the months of August to October 2020 period showed 9 consistent, 50 near-consistent and zero inconsistent outlooks (59 stations across 12 countries).

A summary of results (C-Consistent, NC-Near Consistent, In-Inconsistent, N/A-not available) for each country is as follows:

Cook Islands (1C, 1NC); Fiji (3C,10NC); Kiribati (2NC, 2In); RMI (2NC,); Niue (1NC); Palau (1NC); PNG (9NC); Samoa (4NC); Solomon Islands (7NC); Tonga (6NC);

Tuvalu (2C, 2NC) and Vanuatu (1C, 5NC).

Overall: 9C, 50NC, 0ln.

December 2020 to February 2021 Outlooks:

SCOPIC outlooks: 23% of the 61 stations have their highest probability in tercile 1, 5% in tercile 2, 57% in tercile 3, 8% have near-equal probabilities in two terciles and 7% have near-equal probabilities in three terciles.
