I am pleased to present Niue's progress report.

In Niue's Corporate Plan 2015 – 2019, which is in line of what was presented at the last PMC. It highlighted the 2 priorities of focus which are:

- 1. Staff capability and capacity
- 2. Climate proofing the NMS building

Priority 1 has made significant progress and achievement; however, it is an area that will need to continue its work because we have build a relationship with the communities, the elders, village councils, womens group and youth.

Priority 2 is yet to be achieved due to the limited funding but remains a priority for the next few years.

The work of Niue Met Service aligns with the Niue National Strategic Plan and the Pacific Island Meteorological service.

Niue MET service extended its focus in engaging with the communities, whilst still maintaining its important weather and climate services. Taking weather and climate information to a community level is important to gauge the exposure of our people who are the end users of our products.
