- Highlight recommendations from the Mid Term Evaluation for incorporation into other pipeline programmes and initiatives.
- Highlight the need for strengthened streamlining and coordination of Climate Information Services programmes and projects for sustainability.









Background

UNEP led-GCF funded USD49.9 million initiative to establish integrated climate and ocean information services and multi-hazard early warning systems in Cook Islands, Niue, Palau, RMI and Tuvalu

Result 1: Strengthened delivery model for climate information services and MHEWS covering oceans and islands

Result 2: Strengthened observations, monitoring, modelling and prediction of climate and its impacts on ocean areas and islands

Result 3: Improved community preparedness, response capabilities and resilience to climate risks

Result 4: Enhanced regional knowledge management and cooperation for climate services and MHEWS









Result One Achievements Since PMC 6

- Completed National Framework for Weather, Climate and Ocean Services (NFWCOS) for Niue and Tuvalu.
- Completed National Strategic Plan for Weather, Water, and Climate Services (NSPWWCS) Implementation Plans for Palau and RMI
- Climate Sector Action and Communication Plans drafted for Tuvalu (DRR, Health, Water, Agriculture) and Palau (Agriculture, DRR, Fisheries, Health, Water).
- RMI Meteorological Act in draft and awaiting Office of the Attorney General.
- Climate Services Market Assessment consultations completed with Market Assessment Report and Roadmap for National Financing Policy to be completed in Quarter 4 2024.
- Annual NCOFs implemented by Cook Islands, Palau, RMI and Tuvalu
- Niue completed annual briefing with its Ministers on climate outlook, role of the Niue Met Services and tools developed/ installed.







Result 2 Achievements since PMC 6

- 9 AWS installed with up to 31 to be installed.
- Completion of Hanan International Airport AWOS upgrade: Integration of 1-minute Hanan AWOS climate data into Niue CliDE database
- Vaisala subcontracted to design AWOS for Airai Airport and New Zealand Met Service subcontracted for the Cook Islands AWOS with scoping completed for 3 islands.
- 7 wave buoys deployed in Cook Islands (2), Niue (3), Tuvalu (2).
- Testing conducted on predictors for PICASO for the 5 countries, by producing correlation pattern maps.
- Completed development of <u>operational high resolution atmospheric models</u> and <u>operational ocean circulation models</u> for Palau.
- Completed expansion and validation of a preliminary web-based coastal inundation forecasting system for Cook Islands.
- Developed a new module into the existing Tuvalu Meteorological Services (TMS) ocean forecast enabling new tailored services and partnership with the private sector, directly supporting the delivery of another GCF project, TCAP.
- Ongoing data harmonization meetings between the Regional Technical Partners on portals/ platforms/ dashboards.
- Procurement of Xband Doppler Weather Radar progressing with ICAO managing the process.
- Procurement of data loggers and drones for Cook Islands, Niue, Tuvalu completed with contracting in progress








Result 3 Achievements since PMC 6

- Gender Study finalized and Gender Action Plan revised inclusive of indicators, baselines and targets.
- Development of early warning mobile application on track for the 5 countries. Available for testing in early 2025. Palau & Niue will include additional features and customization components.
- Completed procurement of unmanned aerial vehicle for Emergency Management Cook Islands for Disaster Risk Management data collection.









Result 3 Achievements since PMC 6

- Palau Red Cross Society (PRCS) with the <u>People's Empowerment Project (PEP)</u> completed for all 16 states focusing on training the Red Cross Disaster Action Teams (R-DAT) on their roles as community-based volunteers in preparation and response to emergencies and disasters.
- Palau National Emergency Management Office (NEMO) engaged with 6 states to update State Emergency Plans and supported the Mass Operations Rescue and Contingency Plan training.
- o **Kumiti Au Vaine** (Cook Islands) completed workshops in <u>Mangaia</u> and <u>Penrhyn</u> to improve community awareness, response capabilities, technology and resilience to climate risks and primarily designed for women, youth and community.
- Climate Change Cook Islands (CCCI) conducted Te Reva Aorangi Kupu (TRAK) workshops in 4 outer islands (Mangaia, Pukapuka, Rakahanga and Manihiki). Documenting island-specific language and terminology related to weather and climate.
- o Marshall Islands Red Cross (MIRCS) conducted a First Aid and Health Training of Trainers (ToT) in partnership with the Palau Red Cross. The focus was to enhance capacity of MIRCS personnel in delivering effective first aid and health training within their communities as the Emergency Response Teams (ERTs).
- o Marshall Islands Conservation Society (MICS) conducted an inception workshop on the community based coral health chart kits that will be procured for rural communities. The kits will be used to identify signs, record and report on the early onset of coral reef bleaching.
- O**Niue Met Services** engaged with national partners [Ekalesia Niue, Girls/Boys Brigade, Niue Primary School, National Council of Women] on training and advocacy on traditional knowledge (yams/ pia) and awareness on climate and weather.
- **Tuvalu Met Services** conducted outreach programmes in 2 outer islands [Nanumaga/Nanumea] on climate hazards and weather climate glossary.
- RMI WSO conducted TK data collection workshops on data protocols and engaged with high school students at the RMI Climate Change Week (May 2024)















Result Four

- National environment data portal has been strengthened and currently sharing information with the regional data centre.
- Virtual knowledge sharing sessions conducted on weather radar and QMS with the five countries in partnership with New Zealand Met Services and Fiji Met Services.
- Annual Performance Report (APR) and M&E Writeshop conducted for the countries to strengthen programme reporting and discuss the indicators/baselines and targets in the logical framework, Gender Action Plan and Environmental Social Safeguards.
- Two regional knowledge sharing and training conducted to support the countries (i) Common Alert Protocol (CAP) Implementation Workshop for Pacific. It was conducted in partnership with WMO, SPREP and NOAA to equip the Meteorological staff with the CAP as a platform for disseminating alerts and warnings to the public in line with already existing initiatives and activities. (ii) Joint Regional training on PICASO and Strengthening Climate Action, "From Prediction to Early Action", in partnership with APCC and Climate Centre. The partnership focused on linkages of forecasting models to AA and early warning systems. In addition, understanding the UNEP CIS-Pac5 workplan and budget where they can be implemented for each country.









Mid Term Evaluation

- Overall rating of Satisfactory
- Approved by Green Climate Fund (GCF) in June 2024
- 14 recommendations from the MTE with the main ones on:
 - Activity stocktake, Implementation Roadmap and expenditure forecast exercise: To be completed Q2 2025
 - Coordinate technical knowledge sharing sessions for the countries and technical partners: Ongoing
 - Organise country specific meetings with the Regional Technical Partners: To be completed 2024
 - Finalise gender reports and gender action plan: To be completed Q4 2024
 - Coordinate quarterly meetings with NMHS Directors: Ongoing
 - Radar to be installed and maintained in close collaboration with other activities: Ongoing
 - Develop country level sustainability plans To be completed 2025
