Weather and Climate Traditional Knowledge for Cultural Tourism Development in the Pacific

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Purpose of the Paper

- 1. To inform the Members on the progress of the tourism sector's work on the development of regional guidelines for the integration of Culture (including Traditional Knowledge) across sector policies and programmes.
- 2. To provide the Meeting with an overview of the areas and opportunities where tourism intersect with weather, climate and traditional knowledge information.









Background

- 1. Cultural tourism has the potential to be a strong driver of economic activity in the Pacific.
- 2. A wealth of traditional knowledge and skills provide valuable resources for developing more sustainable communities.
- 3. The Pacific Sustainable Tourism Policy Framework outlines the tourism sector's vision, goals, policies and priorities for the period 2021-2030.









Background

- 1. The new direction for tourism is aligned to the 2050 Strategy for the Blue Pacific Continent, the Pacific Regional Culture Strategy led by SPC and SPREP's work in Traditional Knowledge.
- 2. The evolving developments and recognition of Traditional Knowledge to bridge the gap between science, communities and sectors' understanding directly impact the development of cultural tourism in the Pacific.
- 3. A shared approach is therefore fundamental in enabling cross sectoral collaboration for cultural tourism development.









Objectives

- 1. An opportunity exists to establish a clear strategic direction at the regional level to support the advancement of cultural tourism informed by Traditional Knowledge
- 2. Traditional knowledge associated with weather and climate services are expressed as:
 - a. Cuisine and Food Traditions: availability based on the changing flowering and fruiting seasons with these directly affecting menu options, types of food consumed, cooking techniques and food preservation practices
 - **b. Clothing and Fashion:** availability of traditional clothing and attire, which are common expressions of identity









Objectives

- **a. Arts and Craft** access to raw materials needed for traditional crafts and impact on livelihoods
- **b. Education and Knowledge Transmission:** oral traditions, storytelling and folklore, music and dance
- **c. Environmental practices:** traditional ecological knowledge, traditional farming and fishing methods niche activities









Recommendations

The Meeting is invited to:

- **Note** the update on the linkages between weather and climate Traditional Knowledge and the development of sustainable cultural tourism in the Pacific region.
- **Consider** the Pacific Cultural Tourism Guidelines as a tool to inform future weather and climate Traditional Knowledge policies and programmes for the tourism sector.
- Acknowledge the efforts of the PMC and the Secretariat in engaging the tourism sector at national
 and regional level through the CROP mechanism.
- Note the need for guidance from the Members on the role of the tourism sector in supporting Traditional Knowledge aspirations.
