









#### DEADLY TSUNAMIS

Distribution of causes for deadly Pacific tsunamis. Credit: NGDC





- 76% in Pacific Ocean and Marginal Seas

#### ICG PTWS XXVII - Tahiti, 28-31March 2017

- Close to 70 participants attended from 24 Member States.
- 11 participants from 8 PICs Cook Is, Federated States of Micronesia, Nauru, Palau, Samoa (2), Solomon Is, Tonga (3), and Vanuatu



- •Instructed Working Group 2 on Tsunami Detection, Warning and Dissemination to establish by mid-2018 the minimum competency level for NTWC operations, by identifying
  - a) what competencies are required and
  - b) what training schemes are currently in existence and what guidelines and principles can be adapted for this purpose; and report progress on this task to the PTWS Steering Committee
- •Agreed to organise Exercise Pacific Wave 2018 (PacWave18) to take place in September through to November 2018 to support:
  - 1. International Disaster Risk Reduction Day (13 October)
  - 2. World Tsunami Awareness Day (5 November);

- Recognized the critical contribution of the Oceania Regional Seismic Network (ORSNET) to the PTWS and appreciated the French government's contribution that helped establish this key network and the intention of the Vanuatu Government to continue to administrate the network pending availability of resources
- Requested ORSNET Member Countries and other PTWS
  Members to urgently seek funding resources with relevant
  development partners to sustain this important network.
- Endorsed and commended the proposal of NOAA to conduct a two-year trial for the resumption of the RANET SMS AlertWatcher. This service will enable authorised national contacts to receive SMS Alerts on Threat Messages issued from PTWC.

- **Recommended** Tsunami Service Providers (TSPs) and NTWCs use the Common Alerting Protocol (CAP) to facilitate the messages dissemination process
- **Decided** to establish a Task Team on Tsunami Evacuation Maps, Plans, and Procedures (TEMPP) and Tsunami Ready.
- Noted that while Tsunami Service Providers (TSPs) will seek to detect, monitor and provide threat advice for all tsunamis within their respective areas of responsibility they will not always be able to provide guidance in sufficient time and/or accuracy in the case of <u>local source tsunamis</u>. Member States should fully consider this constraint in their local tsunami response SOPs. Therefore, ICG PTWS countries should reaffirm the best mechanism for responding to local source tsunami is public education, and ensuring their understanding and response to natural warning signs

Attended by 36 participants from 11 Pacific Island Countries & Territories, SPREP, UNDP and IOC

#### 5<sup>th</sup> PICT WG – Decisions & Recommendations

- New Zealand and Samoa requested to consider support for the establishment of Tsunami EWS for Tokelau in collaboration with development partners.
- IOC and ITIC to identify training needs, training institutions and programs and support PICTs in securing funding to enable NTWC staff to receive training in seismology, tsunami science, and Tsunami Warning Centre operations
- Requested the PMC PICI Panel to continue its work to improve communications and infrastructure for seismic data collection and warning dissemination to coastal communities
- IOC, ITIC and other stakeholders to continue support for piloting of Tsunami Ready program in PICTs (Tonga, Niue, Vanuatu, Cook Islands, Solomon Islands expressed interest)










#### 5<sup>th</sup> PICT WG – Decisions & Recommendations

- Request ICG/PTWS Technical Working Group 2 to include interested PICTs in any pilot program that will be implemented to test competency guidelines.
- Expressed its appreciation to NorthWest Pacific Tsunami
   Advisory Centre operated by JMA for extending its area of
   coverage south of Equator to provide enhanced tsunami forecast
   products for some PICTs, and requested JMA to provide
   training materials for its new service.
- UNESCO IOC to continue the position of IOC National Program
   Officer based in UNESCO Apia Office and for the position to be
   filled as soon as possible to minimize gaps in support for
   implementation of work program for PICTs.
